

SAFETY INSPECTION

As a participant in this driving event, you are responsible for the safety of your car. The following is a minimum list of items which should be checked by you or a competent service facility prior to the event. The inspection performed at our events is a safety check of several items on this list. It is an effort to assure your compliance with this requirement. It is not a complete tech inspection. Eastern Buckeye Region PCA and its designated safety inspectors assume no responsibility for the safety of your vehicle. Any car found to be improperly prepared will not be permitted to participate. There will be no refund if your car fails to pass the safety check.

Initial each item

1. _____ WINDSHIELD-No cracks. Functional wipers with good blades.
2. _____ MIRRORS-At least one securely mounted rear view mirror.
3. _____ BRAKE LIGHTS-Functional.
4. _____ PEDALS-Free return & in good operating condition. Firm brake pedal.
5. _____ SEAT BELTS-Lap & shoulder-securely anchored metal-to-metal for both driver & passenger. Modified cars not registered for roaduse and cars without head protection must have 5-or 6-point harness; cars without head protection REQUIRE arm restraints for BOTH driver and passenger ("head protection" means a convertible soft top, closed sunroof/hatch, or Targa top). Equal restraints required for driver & passenger. Race style harnesses MUST have securely mounted support point for belts to keep them at or above occupant's shoulders (seat support alone not allowed). Cross-connector on race harness shoulder belts REQUIRED to hold belts on shoulders.
6. _____ ROLL BAR-Required on all open cars. Must be taller than driver & provide protection for passenger also. 996 and 997 OEM roll bars are OK. Targas excepted.
7. _____ BRAKE FLUID-Brakes should be bled prior to all high speed track events. It is recommended that brake fluid be changed at least annually. Fluid level should be topped up to maximum factory level.
8. _____ BATTERY(IES)-Securely fastened & in good condition-no acid leaks or corrosion.
9. _____ BELTS-Tight & in good condition.
10. _____ THROTTLE RETURN-Freely operating linkage & good springs.
11. _____ LEAKS-No leaks of any fluid-oil, gas, brake or coolant.
12. _____ RUST-No excessive rust or damage to suspension or chassis parts.
13. _____ FRONT SUSPENSION-No excessive looseness in steering or suspension. Lower trailing arm to radius tight. Tie rods secure. Axle & shock bolt tight. Ball joints in good condition. Axle boots & oil seals in good condition.
14. _____ REAR SUSPENSION-Check half-shaft bolts & shock bolts.
15. _____ WHEEL BEARINGS-Correct adjustment.
16. _____ BRAKES-Sufficient brake linings or pads. No cuts or abrasions in brake lines. Check rotor conditions.
17. _____ WHEELS-No cracks or bends. All lug nuts engaged. Valve stem must have airtight cap.
18. _____ TIRES-Good condition. No cracks or bulges. Minimum tread depth of 2/32" across contact patch area recommended.
19. _____ FIRE EXTINGUISHER-Securely anchored metal-to-metal in reach of driver. BC or ABC rated & fully charged. Recommended but not req.
20. _____ MUFFLER -Required on all cars; no open exhausts (100 db limit!!!)

Besides the items listed above, these items should be checked at the track (to be filled in by event safety inspectors)

1. _____ WHEELS-Remove wheel covers. Check tires torqued:
2. _____ LUG NUTS-Remove plastic lug caps & wheel locks. Torque lugs to 90 ft/lbs or to manufacturer's specs.
3. _____ TIRES-At least 30 lbs air in street tires. Street Track
4. _____ GAS CAP-Gasket intact & cap tightened.
5. _____ ROOF PANELS-Must be securely in place; includes Targas and sunroofs.
6. _____ LOOSE ITEMS-Remove all loose items from trunk & interior-including items in glove compartment, door pockets, etc.
7. _____ HELMET-2000 or later SNELL rating required (sticker must be attached-look inside). SNELL "SA" recommended. A helmet with only a DOT rating is NOT acceptable. (note – new requirement; 1995-rated helmets NOT ACCEPTABLE!)

In consideration of my participation in this event, I have, or have had, the above items checked and certify that they meet or exceed the requirements. I agree to indemnify and hold harmless the organizers of the event, and their agents, with respect to responsibility for the condition and preparation of my car, or any subsequent mechanical failures or resulting damage to my car or its occupants as a result of any such failures. I acknowledge that at all times I remain solely responsible for the safety and roadworthiness of my car and am not relying on the safety check made by this event's inspectors in deciding whether or not to drive my car. I hereby certify that I have no physical or mental problems which could jeopardize myself or others if I participate in this event.
